

We would like to dedicate this production to Peggy Lester, well-loved founder member who helped establish BCP back in 1945, who passed away in February. For many years Peggy actively contributed to BCP in a variety of ways. She will be missed by all who knew her.

In June, BCP will be entering the Lighthorne and Abingdon Drama Festivals, with *The Regina Monologues*, directed by Helen Watson, making her directorial debut for BCP.

The Hollow marks the end of my two years as Chairman. Like my predecessor, Tara Lacey, I will be following my Chairmanship by making my directorial debut for BCP when I take on Harold Pinter's The Dumb Waiter in which two hit men nervously wait in a basement for their next assignment - one of the three plays in our July Theatrical Feast. Tara Lacey directs Peas by David Tristram – where we meet a couple on their first date with some unexpected and surprising revelations. Rob Hall directs David Tristram's The Extraordinary Revelations of Orca the Goldfish in which a middle-aged couple cope with their mundane married life through a series of bizarre fantasies. Jem Turner Chairman **Peggy Lester** was a proud and loyal member of BCP for over 70 years. She joined, aged 23, and took on her first role in *Without the Prince* in 1945. Of particular interest for current members, is her performance of *Gerda Cristow* in the 1966 production of *The Hollow*. Her last acting role was as *Granny Wallon* in *Cider with Rosie* (2002).

Although Peggy claimed no previous dramatic experience she quickly entered into BCP life. She was

involved in more than 78 productions, was Chairman (1966-68), secretary (1981-87), and served on the social committee which (in the early days) involved providing set building Sunday lunch for between 12 and 20



members. She was stage manager, prompt, production manager, costume designer and maker, set designer, and did her share of FoH. She ran BCP's costume hire and make-up for many years. When not on- or back-stage she would be found in the audience. BCP was not just a drama group for Peggy. It was an extension of her family and she was always interested in everyone and everything to do with the society right to the end.

Peggy took part in video interviews with her good friend, Nevill Turner, as part of BCP's 70th Anniversary celebrations in 2015. At the Anniversary dinner,

she was thrilled to meet up with people she had shared so many BCP experiences with over the years and talked about the event for weeks afterwards.

We celebrate Peggy's life with BCP by having a

"swizzle of Cointreau" - to quote a line from one of her roles. A very special lady to whom the society owes so much.
