Welcome to our final production of the season, *The Memory of Water*, which received an Olivier Award for best comedy in 2000. Tara Lacey makes her directorial debut for BCP, while passing the chairmanship over to yours truly. I look forward to leading BCP into its 70th Anniversary season.



Since our last production of Twelfth Night, BCP have

been "on the road" entering three One-act Festivals at Lighthorne, Abingdon and Wallingford with Brian Burton's Victorian Melodrama *Ghost of a Chance*. At Lighthorne, in an evening of exceptional high quality theatre, BCP received a glowing adjudication and a very warm reception from the audience.

May 2014 saw BCP perform Shakespeare for the first time since 1999. *Twelfth Night* proved popular with our audience and had a strong cast of regular actors as well as enticing some new ones. We returned to the outdoors for the first time in 18 years when this play was performed at Sulgrave Manor in June.

I am delighted to announce our 2014/15 70th Anniversary Season will be Alan Ayckbourn's *Bedroom Farce* in October 2014, followed by Hugh Whitemore's thriller *Pack of Lies* in February 2015, Patrick Barlow's hilarious spoof version of *The 39 Steps* in May 2015 and Jane Thornton & John Godber's spine-chilling adaptation of *Dracula* in July 2015. Tara Lacey's love for 'all things theatre' began in high school in the mid 80s. Lead roles in Shakespeare on this side of the Atlantic, followed by a national acting award in the musical *Jesus Christ Superstar* and the 'impromptu speech' deliverer in the victorious national public speaking team at school in Trinidad, West Indies, cemented her love of the spotlight.

After a long hiatus, punctuated mainly by a career in Law, marriage and three children, Tara joined BCP in 2008 and has hardly stopped for breath since!

Whilst a busy member of the Executive Committee for several years, Tara has just concluded a two year term as Chairman. She is also on the Play Selection Committee and has been involved backstage as Stage Manager, Production Manager, Prompt and Costumes.

Her acting credits for BCP include *The Tinder Box, RolePlay, Babes in the Wood, The Donohue Sisters, Brassed Off, Wyrd Sisters, Wuthering Heights, Whodunnit, Calendar Girls* and, most recently, *God of Carnage.*



Tara has a passion for music and was a

presenter for five years on local hospital radio. She works regularly with OxBox TV, interviewing both local and international musicians.

As if Tara wasn't busy enough, she formed her own Theatre Company, *Peppered Wit Productions* in 2011 who performed at the Edinburgh Fringe in 2012 and at *Upstairs at The Gatehouse* for the Camden Fringe in 2013. Tara played *Miranda* in the intense psychological two hander *The Collector* which received a four star review.

This is Tara's directorial debut for BCP. She is detailed and physical in her directing approach and is keen to stretch her actors beyond their natural comfort zone. Her aim is always to elicit a reaction - positive or negative; to cause an audience to care. Isn't that part of the purpose of art?
