TERRY GALLAGER hails from Prestation, North Wales and first took to the stage in 1992 as an ugiv sister in a Charlton Village panto - written by the Rector - with characters in it not heard of before or since.

His military background has taken him as far afield as Kenya, Singapore, Berlin and Bicester. This background makes him frighteningly organised and not afraid to share an opinion! Descrite this 'cruff' exterior. Terry's creative and detailed approach to

directing is a loy and he has a canny way of extracting excellent performances from his actors - although his skill with a screwdriver is less successful ...

In 1986, he settled in Oxfordshire and via Ayriho Community Theatre got involved with BCP, in March 2001, by trying to recruit them into the Oxford Drama Network Two weeks later he found himself at The Mill, in rehearsal, for Alan Avckbourn's Season's Greetings.

His favounte quote, he says, would have to be: "Youth has to protect itself, it hasn't got long to live" (William Wilder), second only to Oscar Wilde's "Children begin by loying their parents; after a time they judge them; rarely, if ever, do they forgive them.

Terry's other acting credits include Cider with Rosie, The Proposal, The Tinder Box and A Pack of Lies. His first taste of directing for BCP was with Dial M for Murder in 2003. He has since directed Abandonment (pictured above with the cast). Two, Lord Arthur Savile's Crime (now being revived in Windsor) and RolePlay.

Terry regularly sits on BCP's Marketing and Play Selection Teams, has been instrumental in BCP's involvement in the Banbury Canal Day - a higgely successful promotional activity for the Society - and currently has a firm one on the society's direction in the post of Chairman.

Home for Terry is Middleton Cheney which he shares with his wife, Avis.


