Roald Dahl

was born in Llandaff, Wales in 1916. Young Roald loved stories and books and was often told tales of trolls and magical creatures by his mother. His father was a great diarywriter and Roald followed in the family tradition keeping a secret diary from the age of eight.

He grew up to be the most successful children's writer in the world, firmly believing in the importance of reading. "I have a passion for teaching kids to become readers, to be comfortable with a book, not daunted."

In 1960, Dahl and his family made their home in Great Missenden, Buckinghamshire and here, from a small hut at the bottom of the garden, he wrote most of his unforgettable stories.

He died on 23 November 1990, aged 74.
